Assistance With Adult Social Security Disability Claims



To qualify for services, you must be:

- A U.S. citizen or non-sponsored legal resident
- A Pinellas County resident
- An adult between ages 18 and 64
- Disabled and unable to work for a year or more or have a terminal illness

You must also meet the Federal Poverty Level income guidelines:

How do we determine if you meet Social Security's definition of disability?

After completing the certification process, a Disability Advocate will follow up with you and discuss your age, education, past work history, and current medical and/or psychiatric conditions.

If it appears that you have a potentially favorable claim, the Disability Advocate may:

- Schedule an appointment to meet with you to complete an evaluation of your conditions
- Review past work history
- Request medical records from your doctors
- Evaluate the evidence in relation to how Social Security determines disabilities
