- Board must be composed of individuals, a majority of whom are being served by the center and, this majority as a group, must represent the individuals being served by the center in terms of demographic factors such as race, ethnicity, and sex.
- Board must have at least 9 but no more than 25 members, as appropriate for the complexity of the organization,
- No more than two (2) MMU Advisory Council members may be Pinellas County Board of County Commission members,
- The remaining non-consumer members of the board shall be representative of the community in which the center's service are is located and shall be selected for their expertise in community affairs, local government, finance and banking, legal affairs, trade unions, and other commercial and industrial concerns, or social service agencies within the community;
- No more than one half (50% - for CHCs) of the non-consumer board members may derive more than 10% of their annual income from the health care industry.
- No employee or immediate family member of an employee of the public agency, or the co-applicant may serve as a member of the co-applicant board.

The regular meeting of the Mobile Medical Unit Advisory Committee (MMUAC) was called to order at 3:06 pm on October 6, 2015 at JWB by Chairman Valerie Leonard.

I. Chairman's Report

- i. **Welcome New Project Director:** Ms. Leonard welcomed Daisy Rodriguez to the MMUAC and congratulated her on her new position. Ms. Rodriguez thanked the group and said she looks forward to working with the Council.
- ii. **Approval of Previous Minutes:** A motion to approve the minutes dated September 1, 2015, was made by Rhonda Abbott, seconded by Alaina Robinson and **unanimously approved**.
- iii. **Credentialing & Privileging:** The Department of Health provided a copy of the Credentialing & Privileging checklist for a new DOH dentist, Ioana Stoici, DMD, a copy of the Credentialing & Privileging Tracking List for DOH practitioners, and a copy of the Specialty Care Provider list with 28 additional names highlighted in yellow recommended for approval. A motion to approve the doctors and specialists for credentialing & privileging was made by Tom Wedekind, seconded by Alaina Robinson and **unanimously approved**.
- iv. **Patient/Consumer Recruitment for MMUAC:** Ms. DeGregorio reported that she heard from Laurie Lampert and Sgt. Zachary Haisch regarding additional new members. Ms. Lampert did bring Roy McDaniel to the meeting to observe and decide if he would be interested in joining the council in the future. Sgt. Haisch was unable to attend the meeting, but would bring someone to the next meeting. Rhonda Abbott reported that she reached out Boley and HEP to identify some individuals for membership. She will follow-up shortly.
- v. **Unfinished Business:** In follow-up to last month's meeting, the following items were discussed:
 - a. **Dental:** Christina Vongsyprasom, Dental Manager with the Department of Health attended the meeting to provide the Council with an update on the Dentures pilot and provide an overview of services provided by the Dept. of Health. For the Dentures pilot program, the DOH was able to provide dentures to 70 individuals meeting the goal identified at the start of the program. The funding for lab fees and materials ended with the fiscal year, September 30th and is seeking additional funds to meet the demand. She estimated that the program would need approximately \$25,000 for lab fees as they already have the equipment and supplies in stock. She has started a waiting list for individuals should money become available. [The group](#)

discussed funding opportunities and Lourdes Benedict would report back on HS budget opportunities and Elisa DeGregorio would check the use of any additional grant funds for the program.

Ms. Robinson relayed to the Council that 10 consumers she works with received dentures and that they were very happy and excited to have the opportunity. Ms. Vonsyprasom reported that the clients have been grateful and thankful.

Ms. Vonsyprasom also reported that the Dept. of Health Dental Program provides full preventive care as well as fillings, extractions, and emergency dental care for all MMU clients. She noted that the DOH team also does on-site screenings at Safe Harbor for clients. For root canal services, they have made referrals to H.E.P. when possible.

II. Governance/Operations

- i. **Bylaws:** Ms. DeGregorio provided an edited version of the Bylaws to add a section regarding the Dissolution/Termination of the MMUAC as well as reference to the Co-Applicant arrangement with the BCC. These changes are at the request of HRSA in response to our submission for the Board Authority condition.

Alaina Robinson made a motion to accept the changes to the Bylaws. The motion was seconded by Tom Wedekind and the Council **voted unanimously** to approve the changes.

- ii. **Strategic Planning:** Dr. Stephanie Reed, Strategic Planning Section Manager for Pinellas County attended the meeting to present results from the most recent Needs Assessment and data obtained from EMS regarding utilization of emergency services from the Safe Harbor Homeless Shelter. The needs assessment is a requirement of HRSA and a necessary building block for developing our short- and long-term strategic plan.

Needs Assessment: The detailed presentation of findings for the Needs Assessment was provided with the meeting materials. Common themes within service delivery included electronic referral and follow-up, increase funding for the needed services, more availability of services in the county, dental care needs beyond relief of pain, telemedicine services especially for mental health services, increased funding for mental health services, extended hours, and self management and support groups for chronic diseases. Common themes within care coordination included more care coordinators (staff) with social and mental health counseling experience, better coordination and follow-up, better care and coordination, and integration of mental health and substance abuse services into primary care. 93% agree or strongly agree that better care coordination is needed. Barriers included Access to Care, the Environment, and Staffing. Access issues include access to care when the van was not available including weekends, North County service, hours of operation, services for children, getting medication, delays in the referral authorization process, and supportive services. For Environment, unhealthy environments at the homeless shelters (high salt, fat, sugar foods) and second hand smoke exposure, and lack of education regarding preventive care and healthy behaviors. Staffing barriers included that there are too many clients and not enough resources to meet the needs. Current staff do an excellent job, but we need more of them. One other concern mentioned was that enrollment of new individuals was postponed until the individual obtained an appointment with the doctor and a lack of computer accessibility and connectivity.

EMS Data: In seeking information for a grant application, the department sought data from the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office (PCSO) and the Emergency Services department (EMS) to report data on EMS transports to hospitals from the Safe Harbor Homeless Shelter. Data provided by EMS included all transports from Safe Harbor for the years 2013, 2014 and 2015. Data included the time of day, diagnosis, and hospital client was transported to. Overall there was an increase in all EMS calls between FY 13 and FY 15, with an increase of calls after 5pm. Starting in October 2014, the health center began providing full-time medical care at Safe Harbor weekdays from 8am – 5pm due to an Expanded Services grant awarded in 2014. Data also revealed that behavioral health calls increased after 5pm as well. In comparison, Pinellas Hope received a total of 485 calls between FY 13 and FY 15 to Safe Harbor's 1923 calls in the same time period.

The Council engaged in lively discussion regarding the data provided. Dr. Ravindra added that the spikes on given months could be due to days when the medical team was not available due to training, computer upgrades. Laurie Lampert added that the number for Pinellas Hope may be misleading in that staff may also drive less severe cases to the emergency room rather than calling EMS. There was also a question about the # calls/resident. Safe Harbor has approximately 400-450 residents on any given night whereas Pinellas Hope has 200-250. Drew Wagner noted that in a conversation with Sgt. Haisch that Safe Harbor was seeing an increase in the age range of individuals being dropped off at Safe Harbor. Many of those individuals have multiple health issues and staff work to find assisted living facilities for them. The data also does not include individuals transported for Baker Act or Marchman Act services. Also, while Dr. Reed tried to separate the diagnosis calls into Medical or Behavioral Health, some noted diagnoses are classified medical, but could be caused by substance abuse. Dr. Reed added that there is no way to tell for sure from the data, so the increases seen in behavioral health related EMS calls are an underestimate at best. The group also noted the spikes of services in the summer months. Rhonda Abbott noted that this is across the board with all services in that the kids are home from school and utility bills rise. Also the heat can cause aggravated medical conditions.

The Council will take this new data in consideration during a more in depth planning session at the start of the new calendar year prior to the start date of the new project period, if awarded.

Customer Satisfaction Survey: Last month, the Council reviewed the revised survey instrument that was amended to achieve Patient Centered Medical Home standards. The survey was administered for a 30-day period in September 2015. Daisy Rodriguez reported that 143 individuals completed the survey and reported the results, included in the meeting packet. Overall, survey responses were very positive and none of the questions raised any red flags for the health center.

Administratively, the Council discussed keeping the survey available at all times in the future to allow patients to respond when they were inclined. Mr. Wagner would work to find a location on the van to make it available and at Safe Harbor. Two other changes recommended for the survey were to include the date at the top of the form, as well as adding the site in which service was received.

- iii. **MMU Calendar:** The October and November calendars (included in the meeting packet) for the MMU and Safe Harbor were presented to the Council by Andrew Wagner.

Mr. Wagner announced that the Safe Harbor clinic would now be open until 8pm starting today, October 6th due to the Expanded Services grant being awarded in September.

In October, the staff will participate in the Ex-Offender Showcase hosted annually, as an educational opportunity and to provide basic screenings to participants. Ms. Benedict asked if the

Pinellas County Urban League would be attending with their new van to conduct health screenings. If so, then did we need to divert the van to this event? [Ms. Rodriguez would follow-up to find out.](#)

The November calendar had no significant changes except noting the two days off for the Thanksgiving holiday.

- iv. **Emergency Management Plan Update:** Tim Burns provided a brief update on the emergency planning process for the mobile van. Currently, the van will be parked at fleet during an emergency/storm event. The van will be ready with a full tank of fuel, supplies, water, and staff will be on call to respond after the event has passed and it is safe to hit the road with the vehicle. Both the County and the Department of Health's Emergency Operations Plans are in collaboration with state and federal plans and we will cooperate with all local providers and officials in response to an event. We are currently working to update both the County's and the Department of Health's emergency operating plans to accommodate Bayside Health Clinic upon its opening in the Spring of 2016 to be consistent with HRSA requirements for the health center program.
- v. **Site Visit Status of Conditions Update:** Elisa DeGregorio, Grants Manager, provided an update on the on-going effort to lift the conditions on the grant that were identified as a result of the site visit in 2014. Ms. DeGregorio noted that now three (3) of the seven (7) original conditions have been lifted from the grant including the Sliding Scale Discount Fee, After Hours and Credentialing & Privileging. All four remaining conditions have been submitted for review by HRS within the deadlines established including Board Authority, Hospital Admitting, Substance Abuse Services and OB/Pre-Natal.

III. Fiscal

- i. **Notice of Awards:** Ms. DeGregorio reported that we received three (3) Notice of Awards since the last meeting on 9/1/2015. They include:

H80CS00024 – 14-12 (Dated 9/10/2015) - \$248,872

This award provides supplemental funding for Expanded Services (ES) activities for the period September 1, 2015 through August 31, 2016. As such, a portion of these funds are being provided for use in the grantee's upcoming FY 2016 budget period. This NoA provides Health Center Expanded Services (ES) supplemental funding to support the expansion of comprehensive primary care services to underserved populations. Health Center Program grantees must ensure that ES funding will supplement, not supplant, existing service provision resources. Grantees are expected to begin the provision of new and expanded services within 120 days of award and to achieve the new patient projection included in the ES application by December 31, 2017. Patient projections from multiple opportunities, including this ES funding, will be added to compute each grantee's Patient Target, and future funding may be reduced if the Patient Target, representing patient commitments across multiple funding opportunities, is not achieved.

H80CS00024 – 14-13 (Dated 9/21/2015) - \$54,424

This Notice of Award (NoA) provides funds for an increase to the grantee's annual ongoing base funding in accordance with statutory requirements and, as applicable, new and/or continued patient centered medical home recognition for one or more health center sites.

H80CS00024 – 14-14 (Dated 9/24/2015) - \$0.00

This notice lifts the condition for Credentialing and Privileging Policies, Procedures, and Documentation.

A motion was made to accept the Notice of Awards and funding by Mark Dufva, and seconded by Alaina Robinson. The Council voted **unanimously to accept** the awards.

Agency for Health Care Administration Grant Application: Ms. DeGregorio informed the Council about AHCA release the Community & Primary Care Services Grant Application on September 16, 2015 with a due date of September 30, 2015. The agency will award grants to those programs most capable of reducing health spending while improving the health status of uninsured and underinsured persons in their communities. Programs receiving grants shall reduce unnecessary emergency room visits and preventable hospitalizations by providing disease management; improving patient compliance; and coordinating services such as needed physician, diagnostic, dental, nurse practitioner, pharmaceutical, and other supporting services.

The County prepared an application requesting \$487,002 for the 15/16 fiscal year. The County received approval to submit the application through the County Administrator on 9/30/15.

The County, through this Community & Primary Care Services funding opportunity, is seeking to increase access to primary care services and prevent unnecessary emergency room visits and inpatient hospitalization for approximately 300 homeless individuals needing behavioral health services. This proposal supports hospital emergency room diversion through the addition of six behavioral health staff (4.0 FTE) and services (2.0 FTE). The program proposed will do this by providing disease management, in the form of management of mental illness and substance abuse. In addition, this program will improve patient compliance with the addition of additional staff.

Alaina Robinson made the motion to approve the AHCA grant application. The motion was seconded by Laurie Lampert and the council **voted unanimously in favor** of the application.

IV. Clinical

- i. **Trend Report for Patient Counts/Encounters:** A copy of the September trend report was provided to the Council members indicating that a total of 1,794 unduplicated patients were recorded from January 1st through September 30th for the program. This puts us over the total of patients for 2014. The increase in patients is due in part to the 2014 expanded services funding received that allows for a full-time medical team to be located at the Safe Harbor Homeless Shelter that increases access for those residents.
- ii. **Policy and Procedure Updates and Approvals:**
 - a. **Credentialing & Privileging Policy Update:** Dr. Ravindra explained that while the Credentialing & Privileging condition had been lifted from the grant, HRSA did recommend two additional changes to the policy submitted. Those changes are noted in red on the attached document. There was no discussion and Alaina Robinson made a motion to approve the updated Credentialing & Privileging Policy and Procedure. Mark Dufva seconded the motion and the Council **voted unanimously in favor** of the policy.
- iii. **Patient Centered Medical Home:** Dr. Ravindra reported that we are continuing our work on the Patient Centered Medical Home initiative. She reiterated that by using the Quality Improvement Award funding, we would be able to hire additional staff necessary to assist Rhonda O'Brien, the QA Coordinator, with the necessary actions for the required elements and factors required.

V. Other Updates

- i. **Bayside Health Clinic:** Daisy Rodriguez reported that the contractor has received the permit for all work related to the construction of the site. The contractors were currently working on the site work and tearing up the concrete parking lot that started in mid-September.
- ii. **New Business:**
 - a. **Emergency Authorization:** Laurie Lampert inquired about a situation that occurred with a client following a neurological surgical follow-up that required a CAT scan. It was late Friday afternoon, and she had trouble reaching out to the County to obtain the authorization. While she was able to speak to Dr. Mungara, staff encouraged her to call either Drew Wagner or Dale Williams to address the situation. Dr. Ravindra reviewed the procedure for authorizations with her and encouraged her to follow-up with her on the details of the case.
 - b. **Pharmacy:** Tim Burns reported that the new Pharmacy contract went into effect on October 1, 2015 allowing patients increased access to over 200 pharmacy locations including CVS, Target, Walgreens, Publix and Winn Dixie plus others in the County. Alaina Robinson expressed concern that she was now being charged a co-pay of \$5.00. Mr. Burns informed her that she should have no new co-pays and that the formulary was exactly the same as the previous contract. He encouraged the Council to call him directly if any further issues were brought to their attention during this transition.

The meeting was adjourned at 5:10 pm.

CONTINUITY OF CARE: SELECTING A PERSONAL CLINICIAN

New 11/6/2015

The Pinellas County Healthcare for the Homeless Program (HCH) provides continuity of care for patients, families and caregivers by assisting patients, families and caregivers in selecting a personal clinician and documenting the selection in the patient's record, as well as to monitor the percentage of patient visits with the selected clinician.

The HCH program promotes continuity of care by allowing patients, families and caregivers to select a personal clinician who works with a defined care team (the primary provider and the associated clinical employees who work with the provider). All providers and employees are aware of a patient's personal clinician and work to accommodate patients for visits and other communication with the selected clinician.

The HCH program acknowledges that a patient, family and caregiver may choose a personal clinician who represents the physician, advanced practice provider, or a team of providers, under a supervising physician, who share a panel of patients. It is the policy of the HCH program to document the choice of the personal clinician by the patient, family and/or caregiver in the patient's medical record.

The HCH program will monitor compliance with the fulfillment of the patient's choice of the selected clinician for all encounters and communication including office visits.

PROCEDURE

The HCH program maintains a field in its electronic health record to document the choice of a provider by the patient, family or caregiver. The field serves as the basis for the active panel size of each provider, and is monitored closely by Administration to ensure the appropriate balance of supply and demand.

In the workflow related to a new patient, employees and/or providers ask patients to choose a personal clinician. The HCH program supports the selection process by discussing the importance of having a provider responsible for coordinating care. The choice is documented at the patient's initial visit.

In the event that a patient, family, or caregiver desires to choose another provider, the request is documented and the patient is accommodated. The field that documents the patient's choice of provider is updated immediately.

QUALITY ASSURANCE

The standard is 100% completion rate of the field.

The QA staff will monitor the policy and procedure in the following manner:

- Quarterly monitoring of the percentage of patient visits that occur with the selected clinician and his or her team.

APPOINTMENT ACCESS

New 11/6/2015

The health center provides access to team-based care for both routine and urgent needs of patients, families and caregiver in consideration of the preference of patients, families and caregivers in regards to appointment access.

It is the policy of the health center that patients have access to culturally and linguistically appropriate care in an efficient, timely manner in order to maximize access and continuity of care for both routine and urgent needs. The health center offers routine and urgent appointments from 8:30 am – 5:00 pm Monday - Friday. Same day appointments are accommodated whenever possible, urgent needs are addressed during the hours of operation.

PROCEDURE

The health center abides by the standards for open access. Same-day appointments (also referred to as "same-day scheduling") for routine and urgent care are available daily Monday- Friday 8:30 am – 5:00 pm and are based on patient need and preference.

The health center defines "routine" and "urgent." Routine appointments are physicals, preventive services, and return/follow-up visits. Urgent appointments are those visits to accommodate patients with acute medical needs, noting that the patient's preference will be accounted for as it relates to defining the acuity. Routine and urgent appointments are provided at 15 minute intervals and offer open access schedule.

All routine new and established patients are accommodated within five days; all urgent appointments are scheduled on a same-day, unless the patient prefers an appointment date and time outside of the performance expectations for availability, the patient's preference is documented in the appointment notes associated with the encounter. In the event that the patient prefers an appointment date and time outside of the performance expectations for availability, the patient's preference is documented in the appointment notes associated with the encounter.

All employees and providers have online access to the daily schedule for recognition of the patient load.

QUALITY ASSURANCE

The Practice monitors the policy and procedure in the following manner:

- Monthly monitoring of actual appointment availability, as compared with the defined standards of the health center by appointment type. If the data reveal that the standards established by the program are not achieved three weeks in a row, a special meeting of the administration is held to discuss access improvement.
- Quarterly review of the patient satisfaction data specifically measuring access to care.

AFTER HOURS ACCESS AND CLINICAL ADVICE

Updated 11/6/2015

MMU clients needing medical care or clinical advice after normal operational hours are directed to call the after hours phone number to reach a physician. The phone number is: 727-824-6900. The client's medical card also includes the MMU/After-Hours phone number.

Clients may also seek clinical advice during normal business hours by calling 727-453-7866. Calls for clinical advice received during normal business hours of the clinic will be triaged by the clinical staff and when necessary, discussed with the Physician for follow-up and direction. Calls during normal business hours are handled on a real-time basis as schedule permits, or the clinician will return the patient's call within 15 minutes of the initial contact.

The contract with the Florida Department of Health in Pinellas County maintains after-hours access for clients. After normal operating hours, the phone will be switched over to the answering service that will process all incoming calls.

PHYSICIAN ON-CALL PROCEDURE

Each day the physician shall:

1. Obtain weekly Subject to Call list.
2. Ensure phone and laptop are fully charged.
3. Review all email and phone messages prior to end of workday.
4. Staff are expected to inform on-call physician about client related concerns that might result in after hours calls.
5. Inform answering service if there are any circumstances that might change the primary contact number they have on file.
6. Physicians are expected to remain current with policies and procedures affecting the community public health status.

NOTIFICATION RESPONSE

1. Respond to pager within 15 minutes as indicated by Department of Health guidelines.
2. Identify yourself to answering service, Bay Area Medical Exchange, by name, agency (Pinellas County Health Department) and account number (1630).
3. Courteously educate answering service staff if call is not appropriate. Examples include: adult dental inquiries or Law Enforcement for SAVE Program.
4. Return client call. Provide just enough information to establish correct contact. Notify answering service if you are unable to contact the client. This includes answering machine/voice mail. **Do not leave messages.** Exceptions could include Hospital Infection Control Nurse or Physician's Answering Service.
5. Obtain further information from client, assess and triage as needed to:
 - o Nearest emergency room or walk in clinic;
 - o Present to Health Department during business hours; or
 - o Contact subject matter expert for further instruction.
6. Basic education, anticipatory guidance and/or reassurance may be needed based on the nature of the complaint and information obtained. Normal and usual examples might include: women's health menstrual problems, colposcopy concerns, rashes and discharges.

7. Inform client that we do not provide a diagnosis or prescribe medication without a clinic visit and medical record. Do not call in a prescription, even if the client states that the Health Department provided them this medication and it was lost, spilled or stolen.
8. Please reference manual, literature and books for specific situations. These can be found on the On-Call Physician webpage or in the On-Call public folder
9. Document all calls with time, name of caller, situation, advice given and any references that were made in the On-Call Note (See Appendix A). On-Call Note will be entered into the patient's medical record.
10. The on-call physician does not have access to the health center patient's electronic health record so they contact the provider via telephone the following business day, and verbally inform the provider of the call details. The on-call physician or designee faxes the On-Call Note to the provider the following business day. Upon receipt of the fax, the provider or designee scans the note into the physician's electronic health record Que for review and acceptance. The provider accepts the scan via electronic signature, documents a telephone note in the patient's electronic health record which includes the details of the call. If needed, the provider or designee contacts the patient for a follow-up visit.

MISSED APPOINTMENTS/NO SHOWS

New 11/6/2015

The Pinellas County Health Care for the Homeless program has a written process and defined standards for providing access to appointments, and regularly assesses its performance on monitoring no-show rates.

It is the policy of the health center to assess its performance regarding patients who miss their appointments. No-shows are measured and monitored for internal appointments. (e.g., appointment at the clinic with a provider)

PROCEDURE

To provide continuity of care, offer consistent access, understand true demand and identify opportunities to enhance capacity, the health center monitors no-show rates. The clinic manager assesses and identifies patients who have missed appointments - a "no show".

As determined by the provider, communication for patient missed appointment is via telephone. An attempt is made to reach the patient if they are located at the facility the van is scheduled for on that given day.

If applicable, chronic failure to keep appointments, as defined by three or more no-shows, is discussed with the provider and an action plan is developed. The action plan may include identifying the patient for care plan development and oversight, or simply documenting the no-show, contacting the patient and addressing it verbally at the patient's next encounter. All communications are performed and documented in a manner that is consistent with medical and legal prudence.

QUALITY ASSURANCE

The Practice monitors the policy and procedure in the following manner:

- Monthly monitoring of internal no-show rates, as calculated by dividing the number of patients who did not keep their pre-scheduled appointments during a specific period of time (i.e. a session or a day) into the number of patients who were scheduled for an appointment during the same period of time.

~~MMU clients present many challenges for compliance and follow up in all areas: appointments, referrals, laboratory and treatment plans. Conventional contact methods—letters and phone calls—have been unsatisfactory. One on one outreach as in pre-visit planning has been problematic but efforts will continue as part of Tracking and Managing Care. Electronic outreach may become an option in the future.~~

The Pinellas County Department of Human Services has partnered with the Florida Department of Health in Pinellas County to provide prevention focused health care to eligible homeless Pinellas County residents.

The Pinellas County Health Care for the Homeless (HCH) Program is a program for eligible uninsured, low-income adults in Pinellas County. **People in this program can be seen by a Pinellas County health care provider at no cost to them.** This means that you will not have to wait in long lines at the emergency room for minor problems like a sore throat or a toothache. Now, you can go to a “medical home” for all of your basic health care needs.

This is a Department of Human Services program. It is jointly funded by Pinellas County and the U. S. Department of Health & Human Services, Bureau of Primary Care, Health Resources and Services Administration. Services may change at any time. To understand what is currently covered by this program, please read this handbook carefully.

You have the right to receive considerate, respectful and compassionate care in a safe setting regardless of your age, gender, race, national origin, religion, sexual orientation, disabilities or other protected status.

MY MEDICAL HOME:

Your medical home is the **Mobile Medical Unit or Safe Harbor/Bayside Health Clinic**. Walk-in appointments are available.

Medical homes provide a sense of constant care and a relationship with your health provider that promotes healthy lifestyles and ongoing prevention. They use a team approach to treat all parts of your well-being. Your care team will work with you to maintain a healthy lifestyle and coordinate health services. The professionals working in your medical home care about you and look forward to helping you live a healthier life. In addition, your medical home provides easy access to medical staff through same-day office appointments and some locations are open in the evening or on Saturdays.

Once you select the MMU/Bayside Health Clinic medical home, you must receive primary care **only** at that medical home. This allows for your doctor and other medical staff to get to know you better and ensure that you receive proper care across multiple sites. This is called “continuity of care” and is very important. We want your medical home provider and medical home care team to know you and plan for your care.

Clinical Advice during and after normal business hours: As a patient of our medical home you may contact the health center anytime during or after business hours for clinical advice. Clients needing medical care or clinical advice after normal operational hours are directed to call the after hours phone number to reach a physician. The phone number is: 727-824-6900. The client's medical card also includes the After-Hours phone number. Clients may also seek clinical advice during normal business hours by calling 727-453-7866. Calls for clinical advice received during normal business hours of the health center will be triaged by the clinical staff and when necessary discussed with the Physician for follow up and direction. Calls during normal business hours are handled on a real time basis as schedule permits, or the clinician will return the patient’s call within 15 minutes of the initial phone call.

WHAT DOES THE PROGRAM COVER?

BASIC SERVICES

The providers in your medical home will help you with all your basic health care needs. Basic care includes the following services:

*If you are enrolled in Medically Needy Share of Cost (MNSOC), or have Medicaid cover you can only get basic services listed through this program (no specialty services).

LABORATORY SERVICES

Read carefully! Your medical home will determine the places where you may receive laboratory services. The County will **not** pay for labs or services not authorized by your primary care physician at your medical home or if you choose to go to a non-contracted facility.

SPECIALTY SERVICES

Specialty services are more advanced treatments that cannot be done by your provider in your medical home. Some limited specialty services may be provided as part of this program. **However, there are services that are NOT covered: For example, certain types of cancer and most pain medications are not covered by this program.** Your medical home provider will decide if you need specialty services and make the appropriate referrals as necessary. All services received outside the medical home must be pre-authorized. **If you receive services from a specialist without a referral, this program will not pay.** HCH does not cover laboratory services provided at a specialty doctor's office.

- Doctor/ARNP/PA visits at your medical home
- Wellness and prevention services, such as:
 - Annual physicals
 - Nutrition education and counseling
 - Immunizations
 - Mammograms
- Laboratory and medical services, such as:
 - Pap smears
 - PSA blood levels
 - Urine analysis including pregnancy test
 - General X-rays
 - Screening procedures
- Pharmacy services
- Mental health and substance abuse services
- Cancer screening
- Physical therapy
- Dental Services
- Home health care and durable medical services

Emergency room services and transportation to the emergency room are not part of this program. If you go to the emergency room, this program will not pay for your visit.

For all new patients please allow 24 to 48 hours to allow processing of your prescriptions. Please call Pharmacy before going to pick up your prescription. Delivery of prescription is available from certain Pharmacies to certain locations. Please talk with the health center staff to get more information about deliveries.

For existing patients your prescription will be ready that day of service from the pharmacy. All patients will need to see the Doctor to receive refills on their medication once the refills run out. No refills will be done over the phone once the prescription runs out.

EXPECTED BEHAVIOR

Individuals enrolled in the MMU/Bayside medical home are expected to behave in a responsible and mature manner in all facilities, offices and pharmacies associated with the health program. Before enrolling in the MMU/Bayside medical home, you must sign the Behavior Agreement (page 16 of this handbook). This is an agreement to follow the behavioral expectations of this Program. **You are expected to comply with all the policies of your medical home. You may be dismissed from your medical home for non-compliance.**

Dismissed clients may be provided with a copy of their medical records; a 30 day prescription for their medications and a list of other providers who the client MAY contact for care.

Examples of behaviors which may result in termination by the Pinellas County Department of Human Services include, but are not limited to:

- Rude, disruptive or abusive behavior in any health care related or county facility, including but not limited to medical, dental, laboratory or pharmaceutical.
- Appearing to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs when receiving any service.
- Failure to follow your provider's recommended plan of care.
- Failure to inform your provider of any treatment or medications that others prescribe.
- Repeated failure to keep scheduled appointments.
- Abuse of medical identification card including misrepresentation to secure pharmaceutical drugs. This includes attempts by a client to secure excessive or inappropriate amounts of controlled substances or other medications.
- Any activity that poses potential bodily harm to self or others.
- Any activity that indicates fraud, forgery, or theft.

FRAUD

Fraud is defined as "intentional misrepresentation by an individual or entity which results in an unauthorized benefit." In other words, receiving any benefits you are not eligible for by misrepresenting yourself or others on purpose. **Eligibility will be terminated immediately and suspended for three years if you have committed fraud.** If you have any questions regarding fraud or if you wish to report an area of potential fraud, please call (727) 582-7533.

DISMISSALS

You are responsible for providing your medical home and case manager with a valid mailing address that can be used for communication purposes. The Pinellas County Department of Human Services in conjunction with the Department of Health, MMU/Bayside Health Clinic. Administration is responsible for dismissing you from the MMU/Bayside Medical Home. If you are to be dismissed from the program, a certified letter will be sent informing you of the department's final decision and the actions to take. It is **not** essential that the letter include the reason for the departmental action,

This is optional and dependent on the situation. In the letter you will also be informed of your right to appeal.

- Dismissal from your Medical Home is permanent, unless successfully appealed.
- Clients dismissed from MMU/Bayside Medical Home may not receive any services, including prescription services.

APPEALS

The appeals process is the first step in resolving any dissatisfaction you may have with a department action regarding your eligibility. An appeal is defined as a verbal or written statement by you to the Customer Service Liaison at (727)-582-7533. The appeals process is available if you are dismissed from the program (as described above), or are found **not eligible**. It must be received within 10 business days of the date the department action letter is sent to you.

Note: Eligibility criteria are not appealable. The range and type of services provided under the Medical Home are not appealable.

The Customer Service Liaison will attempt to resolve any problems you may have with your eligibility. Your complaint will be reviewed within 10 business days and you will be notified of the decision.

BEHAVIOR AGREEMENT

Primary care will be provided exclusively in your selected medical home. The providers in your medical home will help you with your basic health care needs. Some screenings, lab work, and prescriptions are part of this basic care. When covered, these services are free. Specialty services are more advanced treatments that can not be done by your provider in your medical home. Some limited specialty services may be provided as part of this program. However, there are many services the program does not cover.

Emergency room services and transportation to the emergency room are not part of this program. If you go to the emergency room, this program will not pay for your visit. Therefore you may receive a bill for emergency room services. If you do not use the labs as specified in the Pinellas County Medical Home Client Handbook, you may receive a bill for laboratory services.

Health care is an agreement between you and your provider. This means:

- You will keep your appointment(s), or call 24 hours in advance to reschedule.
- If you are more than 15 minutes late, you will be triaged for medical necessity and seen or scheduled for follow up as indicated.
- You will respect medical home staff, treating them politely and courteously at all times.

Clients enrolled in MMU/ Bayside Medical Home are expected to behave in a responsible and mature manner in all facilities, offices, pharmacies, and other locations associated with the health program. Examples of behaviors which may result in immediate termination from MMU/Bayside Medical Home include, but not limited to:

- Rude, disruptive or abusive behavior in any health care related or county facility, including but not limited to medical, dental, laboratory and pharmaceutical settings.
- Appearing to be under the influence of alcohol or drugs when receiving any service.
- Failure to follow your provider's recommended plan of care.
- Failure to inform your provider of any treatment or medications prescribed.
- Repeated failure to keep scheduled appointments.
- Abuse of medical identification card including misrepresentation to secure pharmaceutical drugs. Included in this category are attempts by a client to secure excessive or inappropriate amounts of controlled substances or other medications.
- Any illegal activity that poses potential harm to self or others.

You must comply with the patient rights and responsibilities of your "Medical Home". **You can only change medical homes once within an enrollment period. You cannot receive services if you are 65 or older.**

I acknowledge that I am voluntarily disclosing my social security number to Pinellas County and authorize use of that number as data to be entered into the County's electronic systems for identification, according to Section 102-26, Pinellas County Code. I also acknowledge that the Pinellas County Health Program uses a secure community portal for health services outside of the medical home. Only those in our network of doctors, facilities and hospitals may access my health information.

The Pinellas County Department of Human Services collects my social security number in order to process billing and payments on my behalf as a client of the Department. My social security number is also used as a unique numeric identifier and may be used for search purposes. This notice is provided pursuant to Section 119.071(50 Florida Statutes (2007)).

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS (FAQ) FOR PATIENTS AND FAMILIES

WHAT IS A PATIENT-CENTERED MEDICAL HOME?

A Medical Home is all about you. Caring about you is the most important job of your Patient Centered Medical Home. In this personal model of health care, your primary care provider leads a team of health care professionals that collectively take responsibility for your care. They make sure you get the care you need in wellness and illness to heal your body, mind and spirit.

Your personal provider and an extended team of health professionals build a relationship in which they know you, your family situation, your medical history and health issues. In turn, you come to trust and rely on them for expert, evidence-based health care answers that are suited entirely to you or to your family.

HOW WILL A MEDICAL HOME LEAD TO BETTER CARE FOR ME?

There are many benefits to being in a Medical Home:

- Comprehensive care means your medical home helps you address any health issue at any given stage of your life
- Coordination of care occurs when any combination of services you and your provider decide you need are connected and ordered in a rational way, including the use of resources in your community
- Continuous care occurs over time and you can expect continuity in accurate, effective and timely communication from any member of your health care team.
- Accessible care allows you to initiate the interaction you need for any health issue with a physician or other team member through your desired method (office visit, phone call, or electronically) and you can expect elimination of barriers to the access of care and instructions on obtaining care during and after hours.
- Proactive care ensures you and your provider will build a care plan to address your health care goals to keep you well, plus be available for you when you get sick.

These professionals work together to help you get healthy, stay healthy, and get the care and services that are right for you. When needed, your personal doctor arranges for appropriate care with qualified specialists.

WHAT DOES MY MEDICAL HOME TEAM DO FOR ME?

The Medical Home team is your team. They provide you with the care you need, when you need it and customize your care to meet your needs and expectations. We help you set appropriate health goals

and work with you to meet them. We will spend enough time with you to ensure you understand what you need to do to successfully meet your goals and answer any questions you might have. We help you understand all your options for care so you can decide what care is best for you. And we will always treat you with the respect you deserve as a full partner in your healthcare.

WHAT TYPE OF SERVICES DOES MY MEDICAL HOME PROVIDE FOR ME?

We provide comprehensive, compassionate and continuous care for people of all ages.

- Same day appointments
- Preventive care and physicals
- Chronic disease management (such as diabetes, heart disease, arthritis, asthma and more)
- Acute care for illness and injuries
- Well woman exams
- Referrals to group classes to help you lead a healthy lifestyle
- 24x7 phone access to your care team
- Referrals to vetted specialists and mental health providers
- Management of multi-specialty care plans including mental health

WILL MY MEDICAL HOME HELP ME TAKE CARE OF MYSELF?

The care you receive in a Medical Home goes beyond the office visit with your personal clinician.

- We want to make sure you develop a clear idea of how to care for yourself.
- We want to help you set goals for your care and help you meet your goals one step at a time
- We want to encourage you to fully participate in recommended preventive screenings and services
- We will recommend tools and education materials you can use to improve your condition and manage your health
- We will give you information about classes, support groups, or other types of services to help you learn more about your condition and stay healthy
- We will provide you with information about resources in your community to help you manage your health and your wellbeing
- We will provide you with resources and, if needed, appropriate referrals to behavioral health specialists to help you make and sustain healthy changes to lifestyle or to address mental health conditions for you and other family members

HOW CAN MY MEDICAL HOME HELP IF I NEED TO SEE SPECIALISTS OR GO TO A HOSPITAL?

Your medical home team will coordinate your care with all your other health care providers. They will recommend quality specialists for you and your family and will work with your specialist and the hospital to continuously plan and manage your care.

With your consent, your medical home team will inform specialists and hospitals about your medical conditions, your preferences and your goals and will follow up to obtain information after your

specialty visit or your hospital stay. We will also follow up with you and your family to make sure you get the care you need and that you understand your plan of care.

CAN MY MEDICAL HOME HELP ME WHEN I HAVE AN EMERGENCY?

IF YOU HAVE A MEDICAL EMERGENCY, PLEASE DIAL 9-1-1.

For other clinical problems or medical advice, call your Medical Home first. Depending on the nature of the problem, we may be able to save you an expensive and inconvenient trip to the emergency room for problems best addressed by your personal primary care provider. You can reach a Medical Home team member via telephone 24x7, and same day appointments are always available.

If you do go to the emergency room, please make sure you let the staff know who your primary care provider is and ask that they contact your Medical Home as soon as possible so we can help them take better care of you and your family.

WHAT CAN I DO TO HELP MY MEDICAL HOME TEAM TAKE BETTER CARE OF ME?

You are encouraged to actively participate in your care.

- Understand that you are a full partner in your own health care
- Learn about your condition and what you can do to stay as healthy as possible
- As best you can, follow the care plan that you and your medical team have agreed is important for your health

Do your best to communicate with your Medical Home team

- Tell us all about your health, your medical history and the health history of your family
- Bring a list of questions to each appointment. Also, bring a list of any medicines, vitamins, or remedies you use.
- If you don't understand something your doctor or other member of your medical home team says, ask them to explain it in a different way
- If you get care from other health professionals, always tell your medical home team so they can help coordinate for the best care possible
- Talk openly with your care team about your experience in getting care from the medical home so they can keep making your care better.

CAN I BE IN A MEDICAL HOME IF I DON'T HAVE HEALTH INSURANCE?

YES! We accept many insurance plans and in some cases cash patients. Call us to discuss your particular situation. Once you become a patient in our practice, we provide you with the same access and care regardless of your health insurance status.

Beginning January 1st, 2014 most people will be required by law to have health insurance. TAB 2 – AHCA Community & Primary Care Services Grant Application

The agency will award grants to those programs most capable of reducing health spending while improving the health status of uninsured and underinsured persons in their communities. Programs receiving grants shall reduce unnecessary emergency room visits and preventable hospitalizations by providing disease management; improving patient compliance; and coordinating services such as needed physician, diagnostic, dental, nurse practitioner, pharmaceutical, and other supporting services.

The County is requesting \$487,002 for the 15/16 fiscal year.

The County, through this Community & Primary Care Services funding opportunity, is seeking to increase access to primary care services and prevent unnecessary emergency room visits and inpatient hospitalization for approximately 300 homeless individuals needing behavioral health services. This proposal supports hospital emergency room diversion through the addition of six behavioral health staff (4.0 FTE) and services (2.0 FTE). The program proposed will do this by providing disease management, in the form of management of mental illness and substance abuse.
