The Pinellas Trail is a multi-use pathway that stretches from Tarpon Springs to St. Petersburg with interconnections to Palm Harbor, Dunedin, Clearwater, Largo, Seminole, South Pasadena, and Gulfport. When complete, the Pinellas Trail Loop will be a continuous 75-mile regional trail network that will provide access to safe, reliable, and affordable transportation for the residents of Pinellas County, Florida. The majority of the project has been completed with overwhelming support from the community; however, two significant gaps, a "North Gap" and "South Gap," remain. This project will complete the North Gap in the Loop.

The North Segment project extends 6.8 miles from John Chesnut Sr. Park to the Duke Energy Trailhead at Enterprise Road in Clearwater. The alignment follows East Lake Road south to the split of McMullen Booth Road where it crosses the Lake Tarpon Canal. The trail continues south along McMullen Booth Road and moves west at the intersection of Countryside Boulevard and continues along that road to the intersection of Meadow Wood Drive. The trail segment extends west along Meadow Wood Drive turning south at the Duke Energy right-of-way and continues along the right-of-way where it crosses SR 580 (Main Street) and continues south to Enterprise Road. *Map of project area located on Page 2.*
