

What the program covers

- Primary care physician visits at your selected medical home
- Referrals to specialty physicians and other providers
- Wellness and prevention services, including annual physicals and nutrition education
- Behavioral health screening
- Chronic disease management
- Cancer screening
- Pharmacy services
- Limited dental services
- Laboratory services

Case management referral services are available to assist patients dealing with:

- ☑ Physical illness
- ✓ Disability
- ☑ Behavioral health





Taking care of yourself

Good nutrition, preventive care and a healthy lifestyle are essential to improved overall health.

During their enrollment period participants in the Pinellas County Health Program have access to case managers who develop individualized case plans and provide information on maintaining good habits and referrals to other services.

Taking care of yourself now and developing long-term wellness routines may increase longevity and enhance your quality of life.



Required paperwork

Social Security card and one other form of ID, such as:

- Birth certificate
- Florida or student ID
- U.S. Passport
- Driver's license
- Voter registration card
- Work ID or badge



- Bank statements
- Employment record
- Vehicle registration or title
- School record
- Current paycheck or stub
- Rent receipt
- Current utility bill (phone, electric, water, gas, cable)



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- Proof of citizenship or immigration if born outside the United States, such as:
 - U. S. Passport
 - U. S. Naturalization papers
 - Permanent Resident card
- Proof of income for the past 30 days, such as:
 - Award letters from Social Security Administration or Veterans Administration
 - Pay stubs
 - Child support/alimony
 - Unemployment insurance benefits
 - Workers' compensation
 - Rental income
