SBE Policy Change



Pinellas County Certified Small Business Enterprises (SBEs) shall be given preference of award on contracts from \$5,000.00 to \$100,000.00 to the lowest responsive, responsible quoter that meets the Pinellas County SBE Program criteria at time of award, at the discretion of the Board or designated representative. Preference will be given to SBEs that submit within the first five (5) business days of the solicitation. If a responsive and responsible SBE submits a quote after the first five (5) business days, they shall receive a five percent (5%) preference above open market pricing. SBEs shall be awarded economically feasible contracts or portions of contracts.

SBE Policy Change (continued)



What is staying the same?

- The SBE Policy applies to all Invitations to Quote (ITQs) from \$5,000 to \$100,000
- Supplier must be a <u>Pinellas County certified</u>
 <u>SBE</u> at the time of award
- Certified SBEs have an opportunity for ultimate preference of award

- Economic Development SBE program eligibility, certification, and renewal requirements
- Pinellas County Board of County Commissioners' certified SBE goals on Capital Improvement Projects (CIPs) and Consultants' Competitive Negotiation Act (CCNA)



Invitation to Quote (ITQ) Process



SBE Policy Business Days

Business Days 1-5

Within the first five business days, Purchasing may close and award an ITQ if at least two SBE submittals have been received. The lowest, responsive, responsible SBE will be awarded. (Sec. 2-179)

Business Days 6-7

After the first five business days, if no SBEs have participated, Purchasing may award to the lowest, responsive, responsible Open Market vendor.

The project contact will be listed in the ITQ solicitation if you would like to request a site visit at any time. Award will not be postponed for a site visit.

What are the insurance requirements?

Purchasing and Risk have assigned basic insurance requirements and limits. Please review the ITQ solicitation to make sure you can meet the minimum insurance.

Can I request a price increase after award?

Purchasing has included standard language in the ITQ solicitation to allow suppliers to request an appropriate CPI, PPI, or other approved index.
