1. Guest Presentation: Nikki Whitehead, Director of We Help Services, St. Pete Free Clinic

Provided a brief overview of the St. Pete Free Clinic's food programs that provide fresh and nutritious food:

- a. Jared Hechtkopf Community Food Bank is located at 3115 44th Ave North, St. Petersburg 33714. The largest emergency food distributer in Pinellas County. Expanding soon into mid and north county.
- b. We Help FRESH Pantry
 - Indoor Choice, located at 863 3rd Ave North, St. Petersburg 33701.
 - Drive-Thru, located at 2198 15th Ave South, St. Petersburg 33712

After seeing the need during COVID. The drive thru locations were kept open. Serve on average 40,000 individuals per month. Rack cards are available to share with our networks. 70% of the food provided is fresh (fruit, vegetables, lean proteins, eggs, & dairy).

4. Clinical

a. Quality Improvement Update

 Healthy Eating Impacts Obesity, Hypertension, and Diabetes: Rhonda O'Brien presented on the impact of nutrition and access to healthy foods for chronic disease management and mental wellness.

b. Active Clients/Encounters Trend Reports

- Medical/Dental Trend Reports: Rhonda O'Brien reviewed the year-to-date medical client trend report provided in the Board packet through August 2023. Medical: 1,498 unduplicated patients (1,700+ with street medicine included) with 3,606 encounters. Gerni Oster presented the Dental client trend report through August 2023. Bayside and Mid-County were separated out for tracking purposes: 591 patients with 2,156 encounters.
- <u>Bayside/Safe Harbor Visits Post-Move:</u> Melissa VanBruggen shared the trends that DOH has seen through the first 9 weeks of the clinic relocation. Week 7 was low; could not identify a reason why. Weeks 8 and 9 were a bit lower due to hurricane closures and the Labor Day holiday. Safe Harbor MMU visits have remained busy. Trending in the right direction but seeing more no shows and less walk-ins. To help overcome transportation barriers, DOH is offering clients transportation assistance and arranging for a taxi to help with evening slots.

5. **Governance/Operations**

a. Clinic Operations Updates

- MMU/Bayside/Street Medicine Calendars: Calendars were provided in the Board packet.
- <u>Staffing/Vacancies:</u> New MMU nurse is starting this week. DOH is still recruiting for a Program Manager.
- b. <u>Bayside Expansion/MMU Procurement Updates:</u> Progress photos from the September 7, 2023 Bayside visit and current project timeline were shared. The next site visit to Bayside is scheduled for October 2, 2023. More photos to come.

The new MMU build out is set to begin next week. Delivery is still expected around December 22, 2023.

c. MMU Sites/Enhance Productivity

- <u>Past/Future Open House Events:</u> Two new laptops have been purchased for the community connections team to promote the HCH program and enroll clients while the MMU is at Safe Harbor and Pinellas HOPE. Dominique Randall and Dr. MaryEllen Dennis are looking at community events for collaboration.
- <u>Telehealth Sites National Telemedicine Week:</u> The Pinellas County strategic plan goal was to have five (5) telehealth sites online by 2027. We currently have six (6) online and three (3) more pending MOUs and equipment, for a total of nine (9) by the end of 2023! Jane Muhrlin and Greg Dyer are working on education materials and will be out at sites promoting telehealth medicine for National Telemedicine Week.

c. Notice of Awards:

• The Bridge Access Program Grant helps health centers mitigate adverse impacts on underserved populations as COVID-19 vaccines and therapeutics move to the commercial market. Our HCH program was awarded \$31,556.00 for the period of September 1, 2023 through December 31, 2024. The County is working with DOH to identify the best use of these funds.
